

PORT AND RAILWAY USERS CONSULTATIVE FORUM Held on Tuesday 23rd October, 2018 at Sarova Stanley hotel Brief

Introduction:

The Kenya Association of Manufacturers (KAM) organized a half-day consultative forum to discuss and propose a way forward on the challenges that manufacturers and other importers face in transport and clearance of goods at the Mombasa port and Inland Container Depot Nairobi (ICDN).

Participants were drawn from government agencies including Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA), Kenya Maritime Authority (KAM) Kenya Port Authority (KPA), Kenya Port Health, Kenya Railways Corporation (KRC) and Anti Counterfeit Agency (ACA). Also present were representatives from the Private Sector such as Kenya International Freight Forwarders Associations (KIFWA), Shippers Council of Eastern Africa, Trademark East Africa (TMEA), and KAM members among others.

At the end of the forum, the following was agreed as the way forward:

- 1. As a short-term measure, there is need to rejuvenate the weekly (every Thursday) stakeholder meeting at ICD by ensuring representation of senior officers from government agencies. Further, there should be bi-weekly strategy and technical meetings between the senior officers from government agencies and bi-monthly meetings at Ministerial level and include KAM representative in all the abovementioned meetings.
- 2. KAM to lead an Inter-Agency High Level Policy Meeting as a follow up to the Forum over the following issues:
