Introduction and Background

The Kenya- EU EPA provides duty free, quota market access to 27 EU countries. It provides a long-standing commitment between EU partner states and Kenya.

Kenya- EU EPA (Structure)

The Kenya EU EPA divided into 9 parts and has 6 annexes. It has key provisions for the operationalisation of liberalised trade under the Kenya- EU EPA commitments.

Rules of Origin/MARs

The rules of origin provide economic identity to goods produced in Kenya or any of the EU partner states. Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA) provides consignments that meet the rules of origin criteria with Certifies of Origin that confer preferential treatment to the goods in EU.

Tarriff Liberalization

The tariff liberalisation schedule provides commitments by the European Union (EU) and Kenya on products / tariff lines that can be traded preferentially within the agreement. Kenyan manufacturers can access the EU market preferentially immediately. However, imports from the EU will be liberalised over a period of time.

Standardization requirements (Kenya Bureau of Standards (KEBS) & Kenya Plant Health Inspectorate and Inspection Services (KEPHIS)

The tariff liberalisation schedule provides commitments by the European Union (EU) and Kenya on products / tariff lines that can be traded preferentially within the agreement. Kenyan manufacturers can access the EU market preferentially immediately. However, imports from the EU will be liberalised over a period of time.











Trade and Sustainable Development
